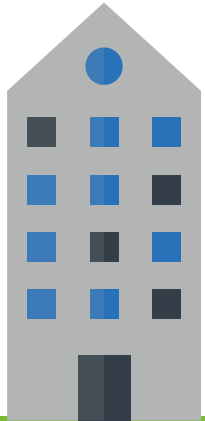


COLLEGE HOUSING OPTIONS

On-Campus Housing

On-campus housing has both single-sex and co-ed dorms. There are lots of different layouts, with most freshman being placed in a double with a roommate

Pros:

- Short commute to class
- Easy to meet other students
- All bills paid (utilities etc)
- Usually provides basic furniture

Cons:

- May require a meal plan
- Unlikely to have a private room
- Can be more expensive
- Sometimes loud/distracting

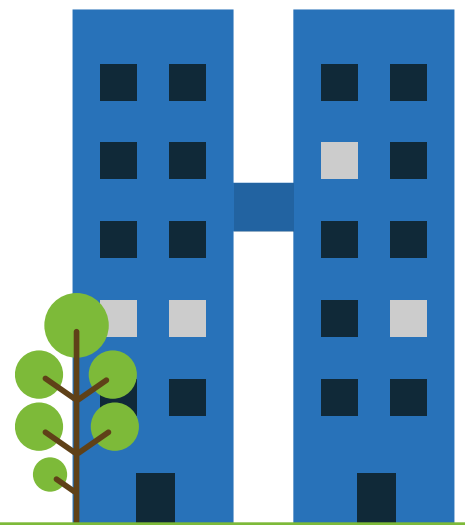
Off Campus Housing

Pros:

- Usually cheaper than on campus housing
- More housing options
- You may live alone

Cons:

- Commute
- Responsible for food/utilities/furniture etc.
- Large deposit (First and Last month rent) and need to be approved



Living at Home

Pros:

- Typically more affordable
- Can stay close to family
- Don't need to move

Cons:

- Commute
- Can be difficult to make friends
- Desired independence can be difficult



Stay Safe!

- Make sure you always lock the door to your dorm or apartment, even if you're just leaving for a few minutes
- Don't brag about expensive things you have in your room or leave them out in the open
- Don't let anybody you don't know into your building
- Check safety and security of apartments before renting to make sure you'll be safe there.
- Check that all windows have a secure way to lock from the inside.
