As you can see, taking some steps to make sure your online presence won't keep you from opportunities is a great practice to start and continue into and through college:

Content to Erase or Make Private:



- Descriptions or images of drug or alcohol use
- Images or photos that could be considered offensive or insensitive
- Speaking poorly about an employer, school or individual in an unprofessional way
- Explicit/Sexual images or language

Where to Check

- Search your name and look at the first page of web results and image results
- Check all of your social media platforms:
 - Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, etc.
 - Even if you were tagged by someone else in a post, it could reflect poorly on you.
- Blog posts
- Easily traceable public reviews

Don't Forget the Good Stuff Too!

There are lots of ways to build a positive web presence:

• Create a LinkedIn Profile:

- This is a great way to start networking and putting your accomplishments and interests online.
- o Ask your network to write recommendations and endorse you.

• Build a Portfolio

- Many computer science majors feature their code on GitHub.
- o Creatives often have a website / digital portfolio to showcase their skills.

Share Your Articles

 Share articles you have written or features in your school or local newspaper on your social media platforms

• Make Your Bios Professional

 If you use social media like Twitter or Instagram, your bio and information you share should reflect your professional passions and interests.

Tell Your story

 Whether it's through a website, blog, YouTube channel, article for your school paper or other creative way, find a way to tell your story and share your passion or art.
